ON BOARD THE VEHICLE, IN PRACTICE

- **Face masks are mandatory** aboard and **hand washing with hydroalcoholic gel when boarding the vehicle.**
 - **No passengers in the front seats of the vehicle**
 - **Maximum 5 persons on board** (including driver) - 2 passengers per back seat row
 - A rubbish bin is at your disposal - You must take your rubbish with you at the end of your tour.
 - Hydro-alcoholic gel, alcohol-impregnated wipes and disposable tissues on demand during your tour
 - No luggage on the seats (except for a small handbag on the knees)
 - Drinks or food consumption is prohibited on board
- ➔ I open the outside handles of the vehicle but only you open the doors/windows from the inside.
➔ I open the trunk from the outside but only you deposit/take your personal belongings and luggage from it.

FOR YOUR SAFETY

- **The vehicle will be regularly ventilated** before and during your tour.
- **The vehicle has been disinfected by ozonator** the day before your tour and will be disinfected afterwards.
- **All high touch surfaces such as handles and knobs are thoroughly cleaned** several times a day with antibacterial wipes.
- The vehicle will be driven with at least one **window open to maintain permanent ventilation.**
I reserve my right to refuse access to a guest with symptoms or without face mask.



OUT OF THE MINIVAN... FOR A SAFE AND SUCCESSFUL WALKING TOUR

- **Outdoors your guide will wear a protective visor** (in the street, parks, gardens...)
- **Indoors, your guide will wear a face mask** (shop, museum, monument) and invites you to do the same regardless of the recommendations at the entrance. Face mask will be mandatory indoors in France from July, 20th 2020.
- Only the guide opens the gates, the access doors to the monuments.
- I will have **some hydro-alcoholic gel, wipes and tissues at your disposal**
- It is very likely that the wearing of a mask is compulsory during certain stages of our circuit, so please **bring your most elegant mask and make sure to respect the barrier gestures** recommended by French Public Health authorities.
